

Seneca Falls—Paul R. Smith, 32, of 150 East 45th St., New York City, a son-in-law of Mr. and Mrs. Norman W. Becker of 62 Cayuga St., Seneca Falls, is in the Bay Shore, L. I., Hospital with injuries received Saturday when the plane he was flying crashed near the Point of Woods Coast Guard station, a half mile from Bay Shore. Ralph Moore, 30, of New York City, a passenger in Smith's plane, was killed.

According to word received here by Mr. and Mrs. Becker, Smith and Moore were flying from Roosevelt Field to Ocean Beach, where Smith planned to visit friends. The pilot was banking at an altitude of about 150 feet, it was reported, when the engine stalled, causing the plane to go into a tailspin.

Moore, extricated from the wreckage of the plane, died a few hours later in the Bay Shore Hospital, while Smith suffered injuries to his face and head and is confined to the same hospital.

Coast guardsmen, who witnessed the crash, took the injured men to the station for first aid before they were removed on a boat to the hospital. Smith, a frequent visitor in Seneca Falls, and Moore were employed by Kenyon and Eckhardt Inc., advertising experts, of 247 Park Ave., New York City.

Smith and his wife, the former Peggy Becker, visited here with their daughter this summer.
